8.* MOTION (Hon. Aurelia Chepkirui)

THAT, aware that Article 55 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that the State shall take measures including affirmative action programmes to ensure that the youth have opportunities to associate be represented and participate in political, social, economic and other spheres of life; also further aware that there are a number of youths who have graduated in various fields and can't access any gainful employment whether government, private or self-employment; also further aware that these youths don't access gainful employment due to lack of a clear career path; this County Assembly urges the County executive Committee to come up with a youth mentorship policy that will guide the County in rolling out youth mentorship programs.

THAT, aware that Article 11(1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 recognizes culture as the foundation of the nation and as the cumulative civilization of the Kenyan people and nation; also aware that Article 11(2) provides that the State shall promote all forms of national and cultural expression through literature, the arts ,traditional celebrations,science,communication,information,massmedia,publications,libraries and other cultural heritage; also further aware that one of the functions devolved under Part 2 of the fourth schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 is that of cultural activities including museums; also cognizant of the fact that there are various cultural activities including but not limited to Kipsigis artifacts and oral traditions; also further aware that there is no museum or archives in this County to preserve these crucial Kipsigis culture; this County Assembly urges the County executive committee to establish a facility to preserve the Kipsigis Cultural activities and artifacts.

STATEMENTS TO BE ISSUED (09/08/2016 AT 9.00 A.M)

1. Statement sought by Hon. Robert Serbai on 6th July, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Health and Sanitation concerning the supply of drugs in Embomos, Siomo, Bosto, Kiptenden and Sotit dispensaries and Cheptalal sub-district hospital.

In the Statement, the Chairperson should state;

- i. Whether he is aware that there are no drugs in the said facilities;
- ii. Why there are no drugs in the said facilities.

The statement was committed to the Committee on Health and Sanitation services (No 61)

2. Comprehensive Statement sought by Hon. Leonard Kirui on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson ***committee on Labour and Public Service*** concerning the County Human Resource Advisory Committee.

In the statement, the Chairperson should explain;

- (a) The role of the said committee in the recruitment process and where does it get its mandate?
- (b) Who are the members of this committee and when was it established?
- (c) How many people have they recruited, promoted and/or interdicted since it was established?
- (d) Whether the County Public Service Board is aware of the existence of the said committee? And if yes, whether the said committee has been consulting the County Public Service Board in the performance of its functions.

The statement was committed to the Committee on Labour and Public Service (No 54)

3. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Samson Towett on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson, Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) on motor vehicles procured by the County Executive. I recently noted that several Isuzu D-max double cabin motor vehicles, tractors, water boozers, lorries, truck cranes were acquired by the executive arm of county government.

In the statement, the chairperson should explain the following:

- a. How many in number, for each category, type and cost of the stated motor vehicles and machines were acquired in the FY 2015/16?
- b. What is the identity of the supplier and nature of agreement (Payment on delivery or Hire purchase)?
- c. How much revenues on average are being collected monthly by water boozers and whether they being declared as Appropriation in Aid (A.I.A)?
- d. In the adopted Budget and Appropriation committee report, the CEC member for Finance stated as follows;

“Purchase of motor vehicles: was allocated the amount to allow for payment of the vehicles already purchased. The vehicles are being paid for in installments which will spill over to the FY 2016/2017”

From the above CEC statement, I need the following explanations;

- i. The number of motor vehicles purchased through via hire purchase agreement in the FY 2015/16,

- ii. The name of the supplier and the total amount spent on motor vehicles in the FY 2015/16
- iii. Make and model of the motor vehicles purchased in the FY 2015/16

The statement was committed to the Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) (No. 58)

4. Statement sought by Hon. Samson Towett on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Infrastructure concerning the Construction of Korama bridge in the boundary of Kimulot-Chepchabas wards which had been allocated Kenya Shillings 14,075,220 during the 2014/15 Financial year.

In the Statement, the Chairperson should explain:-

1. How much has so far been used in the construction of the bridge (the Chairperson should provide documents to support this).
2. Why has the bridge and the road leading to the bridge not been completed up to date?
3. When will the said bridge and road be completed to enable the residents of Chepchabas and Kimulot enjoy easy access to both wards?

The statement was committed to the Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) (No. 59)

5. Statement sought by Hon. Robert Serbai on 6th July, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries and Livestock concerning Embomos tea farm. In the Statement, the Chairperson should State:-
 - 1) Whether he is aware that the farm had been allocated Kshs.10.8 Million during the 2014/15 financial year?
 - 2) How the Money was spent and on which projects?
 - 3) The amount of revenue which the County is collecting from the farm?
 - 4) The number of workers which the farm has employed/hired?
 - 5) The expenditure which is used to run the farm;
 - 6) Whether the farm sustains itself;
 - 7) Why the employees have not been paid their June salary dues;
 - 8) What relationship does the farm has with Chepsol Sacco?
 - 8) Whether the Embomos tea farm lorry which collects tea leaves from farmers has been hired out to KTDA and if so how much revenue is the County government getting from the arrangement and if not then who is benefitting from the arrangement?

The Statement was committed to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries and Livestock (Statement No. 62)
