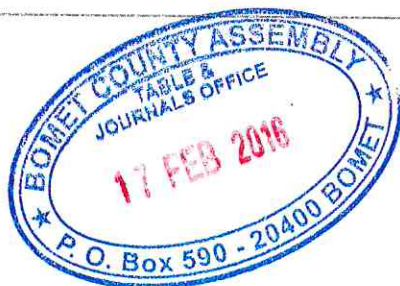

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1.0 PREFACE

Mr. Speaker Sir, Pursuant to Standing Order 205 of the County Assembly Standing Orders, the Committee on Administration, Peace, Justice and Legal Affairs was tasked to look into the petition presented by former Councilors which was read on the 2nd of September 2015. The Committee according to the Standing Orders had a period of not more than sixty days to respond to the Petitioners and lay the report on the table of the Assembly.

Mr. Speaker Sir, in the Petition, the former councilors drew the attention of the County Assembly to the fact that after the Promulgation of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the enactment of the County Governments Act 2012 and the Transition to Devolved Government Act 2012, they were never involved in any consultative discussions regarding their gratuity, liabilities and honorarium during the transition period.

They further averred that since independence, every general election involved the election of Presidents, Members of Parliament and councilors and that their names were gazetted in the Kenya Gazette yet of all the three, it is only them who were left out of any salary and gratuity plans hence were discriminated against.

The former councilors further averred that the Repealed Local Government Act Cap 265 Laws of Kenya was oppressive in that it empowered the then Minister for Local Government to dictate the amount of allowances payable to them.

The former councilors therefore prayed inter alia that the County Assembly of Bomet do investigate into the issues raised in the petition with a view of making appropriate recommendations and legislative intervention including but not

limited to developing a Former Councilors and Members of the County Assembly Honorarium Bill to deal with the issue.

Mr. Speaker Sir, Section 15 of the County Governments Act 2012 provides that a person has a right to petition a County Assembly to consider any matter within its authority, including enacting, amending or repealing any of its legislation. The Committee therefore conducted an intensive research on the matter and it invited the Chairman and the secretary to one of its meetings to further shed light on the issue. The Committee then finally made its findings and recommendations.

6.0 BACKGROUND

Mr. Speaker Sir, the background of the petition arose from the fact that the former councilors were among the then three elective positions prior to the promulgation of the new constitution yet what they received from the then Ministry of Local Government was a cold treatment which only entitled them to draw allowances without any salaries. The Repealed Local Government Act Cap 265 Laws of Kenya provided in Section 150 that, “ A local authority may with the approval of the Minister, pay to a councillor, at such rates as the Minister may specify, or where the Minister has rates as it may determine not exceeding those maximum rates—

(a) Such terminal benefits as may be determined by the Minister;

(b) Allowances in respect of—

(i) Expenditure on subsistence or traveling necessarily incurred by him for the purposes of enabling him to perform his duties as councillor;

(ii) Loss of earnings, which he would otherwise have made, necessarily suffered by him for purpose specified in paragraph (i); and

(iii) Additional expenses, other than expense on account of subsistence or travelling, to which he would not otherwise have been subject, necessarily incurred by him for the purpose aforesaid.

(2) A municipal council may, with the approval of the Minister, in lieu of the foregoing allowances, pay to a councillor a flat rate allowance, of such amount as the Minister may approve, in respect of all expenditure, loss and additional expense aforesaid.

(3) A local authority may, with the approval of the Minister, pay any allowance it is empowered to pay to councillors under subsections (1) and (2), to any person co-opted as a member of any committee thereof as if such person were a councillor.”

Mr. Speaker Sir, the former councilors were also not accommodated in the Parliamentary Pensions Act Cap 196 Laws of Kenya which provides for pensions and gratuities for the Members of Parliament.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the former councilors diligently served the people of Kenya under the defunct local authorities before they were dissolved to pave way for the devolved system of Government. Most of the said councilors now lead squalid lives and can barely provide the basic necessities to their Children. The councilors have also tried to have the matter resolved through the relevant bodies to no avail.

7.0 Oral Submission by Petitioners

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Committee during one of its meetings invited Mr. Richard Ngeno who is the Chairman of the Bomet County Former Councilors Forum and Mr. Richard Leitich who is the Secretary. The two outlined their grievances as stated in the petition and further averred that all the Members of National Council of Former Councilors across the 47 Counties have petitioned their respective County Assemblies on the same. They also stated that they have submitted their petition to the Senate and were subsequently advised by Senator Hon. John Lonyangapuo and Hon. Kimani Wamatangi to petition all the County Assemblies in Kenya because they are mandated to allocate funds

to the projects and programs in their Counties. The officials believed that the issues raised in the petition would be critically handled by the committee and would finally make appropriate recommendations and legislative intervention thereon to address the plight of former councilors in Kenya since independence.

They further informed the committee that they have lobbied the Ministry of Planning & Devolution, Commission for Revenue Allocation, the Senate, the office of the Deputy President, the office of the President and the Council of Governors.

8 Observations and Analysis

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Committee observed that indeed the former councilors were disadvantaged in that unlike the Members of Parliament who had their pension schemes well stipulated under the Parliamentary Pensions Act, the Councilors only had a half-hearted provision under Section 151 of the Repealed Local Government Act. Section 151 provided that *“Every municipal council and county council or town council shall have power to establish, control, manage, maintain and contribute to any pension, provident or benevolent fund intended for the benefit of its officers or a councillor who has held office as a councillor continuously for twenty years or more and to grant pensions and gratuities from any such fund established by it to such officers on their retirement from its service and to dependants on the death of any such officers; or a councillor who has held office as a councillor continuously for twenty years or more”*

Mr. Speaker Sir, the above provision only provided for pension for those Councilors who had held such an office for a continuous period of twenty years. It is noteworthy that the provision was discriminative in that it couldn't recognize those councilors who had held office for an aggregate period of twenty years. In sharp contrast with the section is section 5 of the Parliamentary Pensions Act which provides that, *"(1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section and to section 7 (4), the total reckonable service of a member shall be the aggregate of all periods beginning on or after the commencement of this Act during which he was or is a member of the National Assembly, and in respect of which periods deduction of contributions has been made under section 4.*

(2) Any person to whom this Act applies who has, at any time before the commencement of this Act, but on or after 1st June, 1963, served as a member of the National Assembly shall, if he applies therefor and pays to the Consolidated Fund within a period of one year from such commencement or from such later date as is approved by the committee, all the contributions applicable to his pensionable emoluments in respect of that service accumulated with interest to the date of payment, be eligible to have that service treated as reckonable service under this section."

The Act further provides for former Members of Parliament under section 8 which unlike the mandatory continuous period of twenty years which the former councilors were required to have completed for them to benefit, the former Members of Parliament were only required to have completed two terms of parliament in aggregate. The section provides that, *"(1) Subject to*

this Act, a person shall after the date of commencement thereof be entitled to receive a pension under this section as from the time when the following conditions are fulfilled in respect of him-

(a) He has ceased to be a member of the National Assembly by reason of the dissolution of Parliament.

(b) His aggregate period of reckonable service is two terms of parliament; and

(c) he has attained the age of forty-five years."

The committee notes that the former councilors were indeed sidelined and discriminated against as their threshold was much higher than that provided for the Members of Parliament.

Even if argued that the said members were only earning allowances and not salaries, then the definition of "pensionable emoluments" under Section 3 of the Parliamentary Pensions Act include allowances.

Section 132 of the County Governments Act also provides that , "*subject to the transitional provisions herein, all members, officers and staff of a county government shall subscribe to an existing pension scheme for officers and staff of local government.*"

Mr. Speaker Sir, it is important at this juncture to enumerate the prayers sought by the petitioners in their petition. The petitioners specifically sought for;

1. Enactment of Former Councillors and MCAs honorarium Bill as a legal backup of this petition;

2. Provision for payment of one honorarium of kshs. 1.5million to every person who served for a minimum of one term as councilor in Bomet County since 1963-2013.
3. Provision of monthly pension of at least Ksh.30, 000.
4. Making provision for state sponsored health insurance to all persons who have served as councilors since independence.

The Committee takes cognizance of the fact that what the former councilors are praying for are pension and other benefits including honoraria and health insurance. It is also noteworthy that Part XV of the County Government Act on Transitional Provisions provides under section 138 only for arrangements for public servants who were deemed to have been seconded to the County Government.

9 Committee Findings and Recommendations

Mr. Speaker Sir, the Committee found out that indeed there is need to address the issue of pension of former councilors and by extension the Members of the County Assembly who would have left or otherwise retired from office. It also notes with concern that the plight of these men and women who served the people diligently needs to be addressed.

Furthermore the Committee also is aware that currently all the benefits and remunerations of state officers are set and regulated by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission. The Commission also advises both the national and the County Governments on the remuneration and benefits of all other public officers. The County Government can't therefore solely decide to pay

any honorarium, pension or indeed any other benefits without the guidance and input of the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.

The Committee also found out that most of the former councilors had voluntarily contributed to either LAP FUND or LAP TRUST as their pension schemes.

The Committee further found out that among the members of the Salaries and Remuneration Commission is a member appointed by the Senate on behalf of the County Governments. The Committee is also aware that the same petition has been presented by the National Council of Former Councilors to the Senate and is still pending. The petition has also been presented across all the 47 County Assemblies by the former councilors in their respective counties.

The Committee is of the view that there is need for uniformity of law and procedure for payment of any pension, honorarium and other benefits to former councilors. It therefore recommends that;

1. For purposes of uniformity throughout the Country, there is a need to pursue the issue in the Senate with a view of urging the Salaries and Remunerations Commission to consider the plight of former councilors and the retiring Members of the County Assembly. Once the Salaries and Remunerations Commission agrees with the Senate, then the Senate can come up with a Bill to give effect to the same. This would then be provided for in the Division of Revenue Bill which once approved by

both the National Assembly and the Senate, would enable the County Governments pay the former councilors.

2. There is need to await the outcome of the petition pending before the Senate.
3. Once the Senate, National Assembly and Salaries and Remunerations Commission approve the payment of honorarium, pension and other benefits, the County Government would not hesitate to pay the former Councilors.
4. The Committee further recommends that the County Assembly should endeavor to pass any Bill/regulation or policy to if need be to give effect to any positive decision of the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.

10.0 Conclusion

In conclusion, Mr. Speaker Sir, the Committee on Administration, Peace, Justice and Legal Affairs strongly recommends that the former councilors be compensated for their diligent service to the people of Kenya and therefore urges the County government of Bomet to liaise with the relevant organs of the National Government to fast track their compensation.

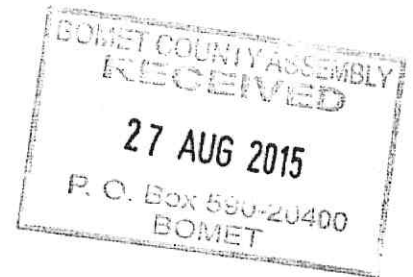

PETITION AGAINST VIOLATION OF FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS OF COUNCILLORS WHO SERVED UNDER THE DEFUNCT LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN BOMET COUNTY FROM INDEPENDENCE TO THE YEAR 2013 CONCERNING THEIR PLIGHT AND WELFARE.

We undersigned 179 former councillors, of ~~defunct~~ county council of Bomet, municipal council of Bomet county council of Bureti and Town council of Sotik citizens of the Republic of Kenya and residents of Bomet County.

Draw the attention to the county assembly of Bomet to the following facts.

1. THAT after promulgation of the constitution of Kenya 2010, the enactment of the constitution to the devolved Government act, county act 2012, former councillors were never involved in any consultative forum discussing transitional matters e.g. gratuity, liabilities, honorarium in the late Karisa Maitha Tenure or ALGAK prior agreements with councillors
2. That since independence, every general election held elected presidents, legislators and councillors and names published in Kenya gazettes respectively. The former presidents and legislators have all been entitled to salaries and allowances plus gratuity but former councillors have been neglected to date and therefore discrimination and violation of their fundamental rights.
3. That all councillors were oppressed by cap 265 especially section II of the independence constitution which empowered the minister for local Government to subject their decision to approval by the cabinet minister including declaration of amount of allowances to get during their tenure. The meagre allowances earned ranged from Ksh. 360 at independence to Ksh. 20,000 in the year 2013.

JUSTIFICATION

- 1) That, we faithfully and diligently served the people of Kenya as councillors in various capacities under the defunct local authorities before they were dissolved to pave way for devolved system of Government.

- 2) That, while former members of parliament and other elective and appointive Government officials are entitled to get pensions and gratuity packages that ensure they live comfortably once out of office there exist no similar scale of justice to councillors.
- 3) That, majority of those who served as councillors now live in squalor and face a myriad of challenges including inability to cope with deteriorating health in absence of insurance covers and inability to provide basic necessities to their children.
- 4) That, despite being elected as leaders to serve the country like other political leaders, councillors were non salaried but were paid sitting allowances.
- 5) That, we have made best efforts to have this issue addressed by relevant organs and agencies without any positive outcome.
- 6) That, the matter raised in this petition is not pending before any court of law, constitutional or any legal body.
- 7) That, we are members of national council of former councillors across 47 counties with branches in every county with majority having petitioned their county assemblies on the same.

THEREFORE, your humble petitioners pray that the county assembly of Bomet

1. Investigate the issues raised in this petition and makes appropriate recommendations and legislative intervention thereon to address the plight of former councillors in Kenya from 1963 to the year 2013, including:
 - a. Enacting former councillors and MCAs honorarium bill legal backup of this petition.
 - b. Making provision for payment of one honoraria of Ksh. 1.5 million to every person who served to a minimum of one term as councilor in Bomet County from 1963 – 2013.
 - c. Making provision of pension of monthly of at least 30,000 per month.
 - d. Making provision for state sponsored health insurance of all persons who have served as councillors since independence.

And we petitioners ever pray.

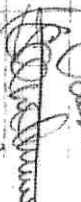
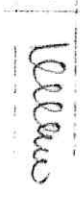

The chair directed that previous minutes be read in the subsequent meeting and thus there was no matter which arose.

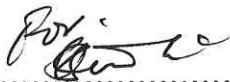
**ADM MIN 03/02/2016: ADOPTION OF THE COMMITTEE REPORT ON FORMER
COUNCILLORS.**

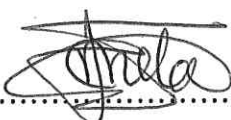
The clerk of the committee read the report and the committee adopted the report that;

1. For purposes of uniformity throughout the Country, there is a need to pursue the issue in the Senate with a view of urging the Salaries and Remunerations Commission to consider the plight of former councilors and the retiring Members of the County Assembly. Once the Salaries and Remunerations Commission agrees with the Senate, then the Senate can come up with a Bill to give effect to the same. This would then be provided for in the Division of Revenue Bill which once approved by both the National Assembly and the Senate, would enable the County Governments pay the former Councilors.
2. There is need to await the outcome of the petition pending before the Senate.
3. Once the Senate, National Assembly and Salaries and Remunerations Commission approve the payment of honorarium, pension and other benefits, the County Government would not hesitate to pay the former Councilors.
4. The Committee further recommends that the County Assembly should endeavour to pass any Bill/regulation or policy to if need be to give effect to any positive decision of the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.
5. The former Councilors be compensated for their diligent service to the people of Kenya and therefore urges the County government of Bomet to liaise with the relevant organs of the National Government to fast track their compensation.
