Aware that Article 183 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that the County Executive Committee shall provide the County Assembly with full and regular reports on matters relating to the county; further aware that section 166 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 requires that an accounting officer for a county government entity shall prepare a report for each quarter of the financial year in respect of the entity; also aware that the accounting officer shall ensure that the report contains information on the financial and non – financial performance of the entity; further aware that the quarter reports should be submitted to the County Assembly within one month after the end of each quarter; also aware that this County Assembly has not been receiving such periodic reports from the various departments of the County Government; this County Assembly urges the County Executive Committee from all the departments to submit the 2015/2016 F/Y expenditure reports to the County Assembly within a period of two months.

STATEMENTS TO BE ISSUED

1. Statement sought by Hon. Leonard Kirui on 28th April, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Lands, Urban Planning and Housing regarding the Construction of Siongiroi Primary-Siongiroi Market centre feeder road;

Specifically, the Hon. Member wished to be informed on the following:-

- i. Whether the chairperson is aware that there is a big trench in that road which blocks accessibility to Siongiroi Market centre.
- ii. The reason why there is delay in the repair of that road yet there was budgetary allocation to that effect.
- iii. The steps that have been taken to resolve the issue and the expected date

The statement was committed to the Committee on Lands, Urban Planning and Housing (No 42)

2. Statement sought by Hon. Stephen Changmorik on 15th June, 2016 on why the Deputy Governor has not been in his office for the past three weeks. The Hon. Member had been to his office several times but it has always been closed. The Hon. Member sought to know his whereabouts from the Committee on Administration, Peace, Justice and Legal Affairs.

The statement was committed to the Committee on Administration, Peace, Justice and Legal Affairs (No 52)

3. Statement sought by Hon. Leonard Kirui on 17th May, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Infrastructure concerning the construction of roads in Siongiroi Ward. In the Statement, the Chairperson should State:-
 - a. Whether he is aware that the construction of the following roads have not been completed yet they had been graded more than a year ago and there were budgetary allocations of ksh.400, 000,000 under vote 3110499 during the 2013/14 financial year, ksh.360, 000,000 under vote 3110499 during 2014/15 financial year and Ksh.209, 596,862 under vote 3110499 during 2015/16 financial year.

- i. Chepkinoiyo-Yoywana Primary road;
 - ii. Chepleliet Primary road;
 - iii. Chemaetany primary road;
 - iv. Cheborus-Reberwet-Greenland-Kapoleseroi road;
 - v. Kimugul-Chesegem road;
 - vi. Umoja-Bartegan road;
 - vii. Kapsubu-Chesogori road;
 - viii. Chelelach Dispensary road;
- b. Why the construction of the said roads has not been completed?
- c. The expected dates of completion.

The statement was committed to the Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public Works) (No. 49)

4. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Leonard Kirui from the Chairperson, committee on Budget and Appropriation on the implementation of work plan and procurement plan by the executive arm of government.

In the statement, the chairperson should:

- i. Provide approved work plan and procurement plan for FY 2013/14, FY 2014/15 and FY 2015/16
- ii. Explain the implementation status of approved work plan and procurement plan for FY 2013/14, FY 2014/15 and FY 2015/16
- iii. Should explain whether work plan and procurement plan for FY 2016/17 has been approved.
- iv. Explain whether the work plan for FY 2016/17 captures the projects

The statement was committed to the Committee on Budget and Appropriation (No. 55)

5. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. John Molel on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson, committee on Education, VTIs Youth & Sports on the implementation status of Bomet IAAF stadium.

In the statement, the chairperson should:

- i. Provide the total cost of the project to completion
- ii. Explain the amount of funds used on the project to date
- iii. Explain the amounts of funds required to completion
- iv. Should provide the Bill of quantities for the project
- v. Explain whether there was a committee overseeing the implementation of the project and its composition thereof
- vi. The sitting capacity of the stadium
- vii. Whether the land where the stadium is situated was part of the land earmarked for construction of Bomet University in the title deed document issued by the president.
- viii. Provide prerequisite approval from National Construction Agency (NCA) and National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA) and specify the date when those approvals were sought.
- ix. Specify the type of contract awarded for construction (whether full contract or labour based contract). If full contract, specify the contractor, if labour based contract provide monthly payment schedules of all the hired workers under labour based contract since inception to date indicating their names, national identification numbers, amount paid and signatures

The statement was committed to the Committee on Education, VTIs Youth & Sports (No. 56)

6. Statement sought by Hon. John Ngetich on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Education, VTIs Youth & Sports on the newly constructed Sigor High School premises situated in Sigor Ward.

In the Statement, the Chairperson should explain:-

- i. The Budget line used to fund the project
- ii. The status of completion
- iii. The total cost of the project
- iv. The amount of funds used to date

- v. Whether there was a prior agreement between the County and National government on the financing of the project since construction of secondary schools is a National government function according to schedule four of the constitution
- vi. To what extend has Moi university been involved in the funding of the new Sigor high school premises owing to the main reason for re-allocation being to create room for setting up of Bomet university?
- vii. Who is the contractor awarded to implement the project (provide a copy of the contract)

7. **The statement was committed to the Committee on Education, VTIs Youth & Sports (No. 57)** Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Samson Towett on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson, Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) on motor vehicles procured by the County Executive. I recently noted that several Isuzu D-max double cabin motor vehicles, tractors, water boozers, lorries, truck cranes were acquired by the executive arm of county government.

In the statement, the chairperson should explain the following:

- a. How many in number, for each category, type and cost of the stated motor vehicles and machines were acquired in the FY 2015/16?
- b. What is the identity of the supplier and nature of agreement (Payment on delivery or Hire purchase)?
- c. How much revenues on average are being collected monthly by water boozers and whether they being declared as Appropriation in Aid (A.I.A)?
- d. In the adopted Budget and Appropriation committee report, the CEC member for Finance stated as follows;

“Purchase of motor vehicles: was allocated the amount to allow for payment of the vehicles already purchased. The vehicles are being paid for in installments which will spill over to the FY 2016/2017”

From the above CEC statement, I need the following explanations;

- i. The number of motor vehicles purchased through via hire purchase agreement in the FY 2015/16,

- ii. The name of the supplier and the total amount spent on motor vehicles in the FY 2015/16
- iii. Make and model of the motor vehicles purchased in the FY 2015/16

The statement was committed to the Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) (No. 58)

8. Statement sought by Hon. Samson Towett on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Infrastructure concerning the Construction of Korama bridge in the boundary of Kimulot-Chepchabas wards which had been allocated Kenya Shillings 14,075,220 during the 2014/15 Financial year.

In the Statement, the Chairperson should explain:-

- 1. How much has so far been used in the construction of the bridge (the Chairperson should provide documents to support this).
- 2. Why has the bridge and the road leading to the bridge not been completed up to date?
- 3. When will the said bridge and road be completed to enable the residents of Chepchabas and Kimulot enjoy easy access to both wards?
