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Preface

Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

The Committee on Administration, Legal Affairs and Citizen Engagement is established pursuant to Standing Order 201(5) which defines its functions as being:

- a. Investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- b. Study the program and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- c. Study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- d. Study, assess and analyse the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- e. Investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- f. **To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 197 (Committee on Appointments);**
- g. Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

Background

Notification of nomination

Pursuant to the provision of Article 196 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 45 (1)(b) of the County Governments Act, 2012, Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017, and Bomet County Assembly Standing Order 51(4), H.E. the Governor, submitted to the County Assembly, the name of Eric Langat Cheruiyot vide a letter dated 30th November 2022 for vetting and approval by the County Assembly for appointment as the County Chief Officer in charge of Devolution and Special Programs.

Notification to the Assembly and Referral to the Committee on Administration, Legal Affairs and Citizen Engagement.

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 42(1), the Speaker, vide a communication dated Thursday, 30th November 2022, informed the Assembly of the Governor's message to the Assembly on the nomination of County Chief Officers, for approval by the County Assembly.

Pursuant to Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017 and Standing Order 51 (1), the name of the nominee was referred to the Committee on Administration, Legal Affairs and Citizen Engagement for approval hearings and reporting to the Assembly.

Notification to the Public

The Constitution and the County Governments Act, 2012 requires the County Assembly to facilitate a public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other businesses of the Assembly and its Committees.

Section 7(5) of the of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 2017 further provides that the Committee shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearings.

Further, section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act 2017 provides that;

"any person may, prior to the approval hearings and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".

Pursuant to section 7(10) of Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on 1st December, 2022 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of a written statement on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee for the position to which he was nominated to serve. The advertisement indicated that the said submissions from the public were to be received by Friday, 9th December, 2022 at 5.00 pm.

Notification to the Nominee

On Friday, 2nd November, 2022, the Clerk of the County Assembly invited the nominee, in writing, for the approval hearings in accordance with Section 7(4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The nominee was required to appear before the committee on Wednesday, 14th December, 2022 at 9. 00 a.m.

Clearance and Compliance Requirements

On Friday, 2nd November, 2022, the Clerk of the County Assembly wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission requesting for reports with respect to the nominee on his integrity.

Further, the Clerk, in his notification to the nominee required him in writing to bring letters or certificates of compliance and clearance during the vetting exercise from:-

1. Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC),
2. Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA),
3. Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI),
4. The Higher Education Loans Board (HELB)
5. Any of the credit Reference Bureaus

Committee meetings

The committee held a total of three meetings, and on 14th December, 2022, the said nominee appeared before the committee and an approval hearing was conducted in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017 for appointment as the County Chief Officers in charge of Devolution and Special Programs.

In a meeting held on 30th December, 2022, the Committee resolved to invite the nominee for approval hearing at the County Assembly Board room on Wednesday, the 14th day of December, 2022.

In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee made reference to the Constitution, the County Governments Act, 2012, the Leadership and Integrity Act, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No 5 of 2017 and the County Assembly Standing Orders.

The Committee complied with the Constitutional and legal requirements in its procedure for vetting. It ensured that there was public participation, transparency, and openness in carrying out the approval hearing exercise.

Notifications and invitations of the general public to submit memoranda were placed in the mainstream print media on 1st December, 2022 in compliance with the provision of Sections 91 and 95 of the County Governments Act 2012.

Acknowledgment

The Committee on Administration, Legal Affairs and Citizen Engagement wishes to thank the Office of the Speaker, the Office of the Clerk, and the staff of the County Assembly for the logistical support accorded to it during the vetting exercise and execution of the committee's mandate. 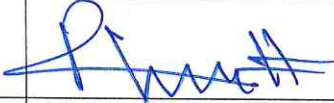
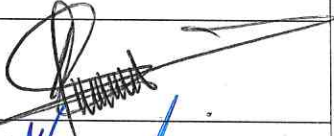
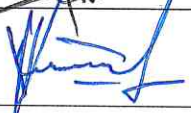

Approval Hearing of the Nominee

Issues for Consideration

The Committee held a sitting on 13th December, 2022 to deliberate on the approval hearings and noted the following —

- (1) That, the nominee had not notified the Clerk of the County Assembly of his withdrawal from the approval process as outlined under Section 7(12) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.
- (2) That, Section 45 of the County Governments Act, requires H.E. the Governor to nominate and appoint qualified and experienced county chief officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board with the approval of the County Assembly.
- (3) That, Section 45 of the County Governments Act, provides that a county chief officer shall be responsible to the respective county executive committee member for the administration of a county department and shall be the authorized officer in respect of the exercise of delegated power.
- (4) Further, the committee required the nominee to submit the following documents;
 - i. A filled questionnaire for vetting/approval of the nominee for the position of the County Chief Officer.
 - ii. Curriculum Vitae, Personal Credentials, and Academic Certificates
 - iii. Clearance Certificate from the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB)
 - iv. Certificate of Good Conduct from the Department of Criminal Investigations (DCI)
 - v. Tax Compliance Certificate from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)

- vi. Sworn self-declaration form submitted to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC)
 - vii. Clearance Certificate from Credit Reference Bureau.
- (5) That, the Committee would therefore proceed with the approval hearings on Wednesday 14th, December 2022; and
 - (6) That, the Committee would examine the nominees against the criteria set out in Sections 7 and 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

Submission of memoranda

By the close of business on 9th December, 2022, the Committee had not received any memoranda from the public contesting the suitability or otherwise of the nominee.

Issues for consideration

In conducting the approval hearing, the Committee was guided by Article 73 (2) (a), (b), (c) and (e) of the Constitution, Section 45 of the County Governments Act and the provisions of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act 2017.

Article 73(2) of the Constitution on leadership and Integrity provides as follows:

That the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include;

- a. Selection based on personal integrity, competence, and suitability in free and fair elections;
- b. Objectivity and impartiality in decision making and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives, or corrupt practices.

c. Selfless services based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by:

- i. Honesty in the execution of public duties
- ii. The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.
- iii. Accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
- iv. Discipline and commitment to service to the people.

In conducting the vetting process, the Committee examined the nominee against the following criteria, in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act 2017.

- i. Academic Qualifications
- ii. Employment Record
- iii. Knowledge of the relevant subject/ role of County Chief Executive Officer
- iv. Appreciation of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, Acts of Parliament, and Devolution
- v. Overall suitability for the position
- vi. Compliance and integrity

Submission

Oral Submission from Mr. Eric Langat Cheruiyot - Nominee for the appointment of the County Chief Officer for Devolution and Special Programs

During its sitting on Wednesday 14th December, 2022 at the County Assembly Board Room, the Committee held an approval hearing and orally interviewed the nominee. The minutes of the proceedings are annexed to this report.

The following are the oral submissions from the nominee;

Date, birthplace, residence, and Education background

He is a Kenyan citizen of ID/No. 13546897 born in Kapsimbiri in Bomet County. He resides in Koma village within Silibwet Township Ward.

On his education background, the nominee told the committee that he holds a Master's degree in Applied Economics of Illinois State University, United States of America (2007 – 2009), Bachelor of Science in Economics from Illinois State University, (2005 - 2006) and Bachelor of Science, Mathematics (2000 - 2003) from Ohio University. He did his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) at Kabarak high school in 1993.

He also attended Strathmore College of Accountancy where he acquired a Certified Public Accounts 1 certificate from the KASNEB in 1999.

Employment record

The nominee stated that his work experience spans for about twenty years which period he has been working in institutions including;

- a. County Government of Bomet – The nominee submitted that he was appointed on November 2022 as the joint secretary of the Taskforce on Development Programs and Legacy Projects a position he holds to date.
- b. Life Care Hospital (March 2021 – June 2022)- Head of Insurance and Corporates in the Nyanza region and lower Narok. He stated that as a head, he was responsible for and creation of sales structure and supervision of sales executives and creation of systems for operations in the institution.
- c. Bliss Healthcare (2013-2021), Lifecare Hospital (July 2014 – Jan 2021). The nominee stated that he served as a scheme manager and overall in charge of resolution insurance schemes where he rose through the ranks to being a deputy manager in charge of operations and an administrative coordinator of eight regional medical superintendents.
- d. Stevenson Center for Community and Economic Development (2009 - 2012) – The nominee stated that he was worked as a research assistant responsible for collection, evaluation and analysis of research data.
- e. Illinois State University (2007-2009)– He stated that he was a graduate assistant responsible for tutoring undergraduate.
- f. Nationwide Insurance, Pennsylvania (2004-2005). He indicated that he worked as an insurance officer where he collected customer data to calculate their premium quotes.

Income and net worth

The nominee estimated his financial net worth at Kshs. 72 Million comprising of real estate, SACCO and company shares, motor vehicles, farms and employment income.

Pro bono/Charity Work

The nominee stated that he has supported students in paying their school fees and currently supporting three students who are studying in various secondary schools.

Integrity

The nominee informed the committee that he has never been charged in a court of law or mentioned in an investigatory report or any commission of inquiry in the last three years. He further stated that he has never been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of Article 75 of the Constitution.

General Submissions

To examine the suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the committee posed questions to the nominee in the following thematic areas. The nominee responded as follows;

Skills and Expertise

He explained that he brings along hard work, resilience, communication and analytical skills owing to his vast work experience in the insurance sector. He further stated that as the election campaign manager and the joint secretary secretary of the Taskforce on Development Programs and Legacy Projects, he understood the Governor's manifesto during the campaigns for the last General Election. His interest in the position of the County Chief Officer for

Devolution and Special Programs was occasioned by the urge to implement the flagship projects that the Governor laid in his manifesto.

Role of the County Chief Officer in the Department of Devolution and Special Programs

The nominee stated that the department is domiciled in the department of administration, public service and special programs. He submitted that his responsibilities will be cut out as coordination of county special programmes and mobilization of the Governor's legacy based projects and programmes. He also stated the department is largely divided into two sub-departments each headed by a chief officer. If appointed, he will welcome any other function that he may be assigned to the office from time to time.

County executive's departmental sector goals

The nominee informed the committee that if approved, he will facilitate the relations between the national and county governments in order to expedite the implementation of the flagship projects including the Kenya Software Factory in Mulot and the Mother and Child Wellness Center at Ng'ung'unyat in Bomet East. He also stated that his other objective is to roll out the comprehensive capacity building of staff to enable them to discharge their duties efficiently and effectively.

County flagship projects

The nominee explained that since he was the Governor's campaign team manager, he understood the crucial projects that the Governor listed in his

manifesto and that key among them is the establishment of Mother and Child Wellness Centre and the Governor's School feeding programme.

He further submitted that he is aware that the establishment of the Mother and Child Wellness Center in Bomet East resulted in a discussion on whether it was the suitable location considering the sub-county hosts the county's referral hospital. He said, if approved, he will advise the Office of the Governor to consider improving other health facilities in other part of the county as an equitable way of distributing major projects. He further stated that, if approved, he will partner with existing and other donors with a view to proposing other flagship projects in other sub-counties.

On the issue of school feeding programme, the nominee stated that, it has been established that the cost of packaging the milk is more expensive than the milk itself. He proposed that, if approved and in consultation with other responsible departments, he will offer various possibilities that will be suitable to the programme.

Devolution laws that guides the operations of the Department of Devolution and Special Programs

The nominee stated that he will be guided by the Constitution, the Public Finance Management Act, Public Procurement and Disposal Act and the Public Officers Integrity Act among other statutes. He further stated that he will also be guided by the democratic ideals on the separation of powers, consideration of two-third gender rule and other policies as required by law.

The tools necessary in citizen engagement

He indicated that, if approved, he will operate an open door policy as envisaged in the principle of public participation. He further said he will initiate a forum of engagement between the department and other stakeholders with a view to introducing policies that are originated from the residents of Bomet County.

Public sector experience

The nominee appreciated that his work experience is exclusively in the private sector and that he has never worked in a public sector save for being the Chairperson of the Governor's Taskforce on Flagship projects. He stated that, if approved, he is a team player and a fast learner and that he will execute his duties in accordance with the public service procedures and practices.

Conflicts in the Department of Administration, Public Service and Special Programs

He stated that he is aware that the department has a chief officer for administration and public service and another for devolution and special programs. In his response, he said the roles of the two officers are well cut out and there will be no conflict whatsoever between the two offices.

Department's Budget

The nominee stated that the Executive Order No. 1 of 2022 on the organization of the County Government of Bomet restructured the department in two main sections. He explained that the reorganization will have an impact on the financing of the department since the budget for the financial year 2022/2023 was passed way before the reorganization. He stated that there is need for a supplementary budget to reflect the new arrangement.

Committee's Observations

After the vetting exercise, the committee made the following observations concerning the nominee.

Integrity

The Committee noted the following about documents submitted by the nominee

3.	Education and Training (Relevant to the portfolio)	The committee observed that the nominee demonstrated knowledge and expertise on technical issues touching on devolution and government programs.
4.	Work Experience as it relates to the position	That the nominee has over twenty years of experience in administrative positions in the insurance sector and currently the secretary of the Taskforce on Development Programs

		and Legacy Projects. However, the committee noted that he has no public service experience.
5.	Professional skills and technical skills	That the nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues and has requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve.
6.	Additional skills as per the position applied for	The nominee has been instrumental as the secretary of the Taskforce on Development Programs and Legacy Projects. The committee observed that he has the capacity to serve as the County Chief Officer for Devolution and Special Programs.
7.	Vast knowledge on the laws of Kenya and other guiding principles e.g. The Constitution of Kenya, 2010, The devolution laws, vision 2030, etc.	The committee observed that the nominee is well conversant with the relevant statutes and government policies necessary for the administration of the department he is nominated for.
8.	Leadership and Integrity as per Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.	The committee observed that the nominee satisfied the requirements of Chapter Six having obtained clearances from the EACC, KRA, HELB, CRB and DCI.
9.	Decision making and problem-solving skills	The committee also observed that based on his responses during the approval hearing, the nominee clearly portrayed great ability in

		problem solving on matters devolution and county programs.
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Committee's findings

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The Committee having observed the oral submissions by the nominee and the documents submitted to it, made the following findings:

1. THAT, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having obtained clearance from the following statutory bodies; the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), and the Higher Education Loan Board (HELB).
2. THAT his academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 7(8) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5 of 2022.
3. THAT Pursuant to Section 45 of the County Government Act, 2012; the Committee found the nominee suitable for appointment as the County Chief Executive Officer in charge of Devolution and Special Programs.

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Committee's Recommendation

At the end of the vetting process, the Committee made the following recommendation:

That; having considered the suitability, capacity, and integrity of the nominee, and according to **Section 9 (2) of Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017**, the Committee recommends that the County Assembly approve the nomination and subsequent appointment of **Eric Langat Cheruiyot** for the position of County Chief Executive Officer in charge of Devolution and Special Programs.

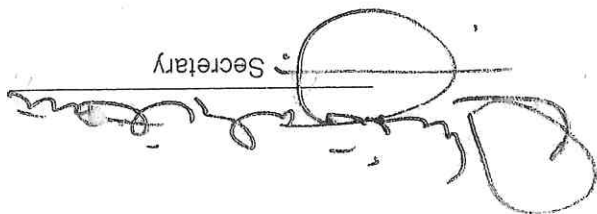

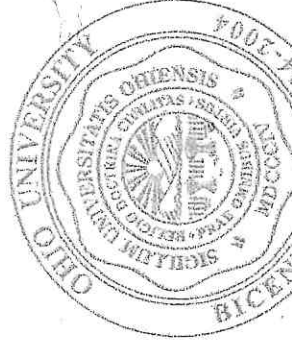
