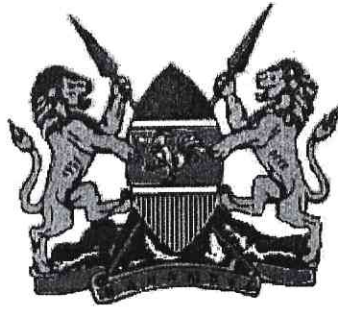

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1.0 PREFACE

Mr. Speaker Sir,

On behalf of the Committee on Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports and pursuant to Standing Order 193(5) (f), it is my duty and pleasure to present to the County Assembly, the Committee's report on the vetting of the nominee for appointment as Chief Officer in charge of Education and Vocational Training.

The Committee on Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports is one of the Sectoral committees established under Standing Order 193(1). It is therefore the relevant Committee that is mandated to vet and report for approval by the County Assembly, nominations made under Section 45(1) (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012.

1.1 Committee Membership

1.2 Committee's Mandate

Mr. Speaker,

The Sectoral Committee on Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports derives its mandate from provisions of Standing Order 193(5) and the Second Schedule to the Standing Orders which defines functions of the Committee as being:

- a) To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- b) To study the programmes and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of their implementation;
- c) To study and review all legislations referred to it;
- d) To study, assess and analyze the relative success of the departments measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- e) To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as may be deemed necessary, and as may be referred to it by the County Assembly;
- f) To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 188(Committee on appointments);and
- g) To make reports and recommendations to the Assembly as often as possible, including recommendations of proposed legislation.

1.3 Nomination of the County Chief Officer In charge of the department of Education and Vocational Training

Mr. Speaker,

Pursuant to Section 45(1)(a) of the County Governments Act, 2012, the Governor forwarded to the Speaker of the County Assembly, the name of Juliana Sigey Rono vide letter dated 5th December, 2017 for vetting and approval by the County Assembly for appointment as the County Chief Officer In charge of the department of Education and Vocational Training. The nominee was then committed to the

Committee on Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports which was to conduct vetting of the nominee and report to the Assembly as provided for under the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

1.4 Committee Meetings

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The committee held a total four meetings and in one of the meetings the said nominee appeared for vetting in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 for appointment as the Chief Officer in charge of the department of Education and Vocational Training.

The Committee resolved to invite the nominee for an approval hearing at the County Assembly's Chamber on Monday 18th December, 2017. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee made reference to the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the County Governments Act, 2012 and the County Assembly Standing Orders.

The Committee complied with the Constitutional and legal requirements and the established procedures for vetting. It ensured that there was public participation and openness in carrying out the vetting exercise. Notifications and invitations to the public to submit memoranda were placed in the mainstream print media as required by law.

The Committee wishes to thank the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk for the support accorded to it during the vetting exercise and execution of the committee's mandate.

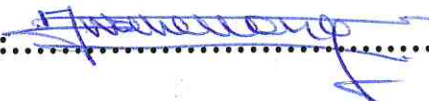

4.0 Background

The Committee on Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports is one of the Sectoral committees established under Standing order No. 193(1) and deals with all county matters relating to Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports including appointments that require the County Assembly's approval.

Section 45 of the County Governments Act establishes the office of the County Chief Officer. The section requires the Governor to nominate and with the approval of the County Assembly, appoint County Chief Officers.

Section 45 (1) of the County Governments Act further provides that the Governor shall-

- a) nominate qualified and experienced county chief officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board; and
- b) with the approval of the county assembly, appoint county Chief Officers.

Additionally, the procedure for approval hearing, issues for consideration and the period for consideration and reporting is provided for under the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5 of 2017.

Article 73(2) of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity provides as that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include;

- a) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability in free and fair elections;
- b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices.
- c) Selfless services based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by-
 - i. Honesty in the execution of public duties
 - ii. The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.
 - iii. Accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - iv. Discipline and commitment in service to the people.

4.1 Issues for consideration in conducting the Approval hearing

In conducting the Approval hearing, the Committee was guided by Article 73(2)(a)(b) (c) and (e) of the Constitution, Section 7(8) and Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5 of 2017.

Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant County Assembly in relation to any nomination shall be—

- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee including the criteria for the short listing of the nominees;
- (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's credentials, abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

4.2 Appointment Process of a County Chief Officer

Pursuant to Section 45 (1) of the County Governments Act, 2012, the Governor forwarded to the Speaker of the County Assembly, the name of Mrs. Juliana Sigey Rono vide a letter dated 5th December, 2017 for vetting and consideration for approval by the County Assembly for appointment as the County Chief Officer in charge of Education and Vocational Training.

On 6th December, 2017, the name of the nominee was tabled in the Assembly and the Hon. Speaker directed that the nominee be referred to the Committee on Education, Vocational Training, Youths and Sports for vetting and report to the Assembly within 14 days.

4.3 Notification to the nominee

On 8th December, 2017, the Clerk of the Assembly, pursuant to Section 7(4) of the **Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5 of 2017**

notified the nominee of the time and place for holding the approval hearing through an advert in the print media.

4.4 Notification to the public

The public was expected to participate in the vetting process through submission of memoranda (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominee. On 8th December, 2017, pursuant to section 7(4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media and the Assembly's website inviting the public to submit memoranda by Friday 15th December, 2017 on the said nominee.

4.5 Committee meetings

The Committee conducted a vetting session on Monday 18th December, 2017. However, before the nominee was invited to appear; the committee held a session in order to deliberate and agree on the mode of vetting in line with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017.

4.6 Submission of memoranda

Mr. Speaker Sir,

At the close of business on Friday, 15th December, 2017, the Committee had not received any memoranda from the public.

4.7 The Vetting Process

The committee allocated the nominee a maximum of one and a half hours for vetting. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017 and the County Assembly Standing Orders.

The Committee also considered the following criteria in vetting the nominee;

- a) Employment record and work experience
- b) Public office, political activities and affiliations

- c) Potential conflict of interest
- d) Suitability to the position
- e) Integrity
- f) General knowledge on public affairs

4.8 Submission of relevant documents from the nominee

The committee received the following documents from the nominee;

- i. Curriculum Vitae, personal credentials and academic certificates.
- ii. Online Compliance Certificate from Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)
- iii. Clearance Certificate from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC).
- iv. Clearance Certificate from the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB)
- v. Police Clearance Certificate from the Criminal Investigation Department (CID).
- vi. Clearance Certificate from Credit Reference Bureau (CRB)

4.9 Vetting of Juliana Sigey Rono

Upon appearing before the committee on Monday 18th December, 2017, the nominee submitted to the committee as follows;

- (a) She indicated that she comes from Kembu Ward in Bomet East sub-county.
- (b) She also indicated that she attended Chebangang Primary school, Kipsigis Girls High School for 'O' Level, Kipsigis Girls High School for 'A' Level, Kisii Teachers' College for a Diploma in Education (Humanities), Kenyatta University for Bachelor of Education (ECE) and Egerton University for a Master of Education (Curriculum and Instruction).
- (c) She is the current Director for Education, Bomet County Government. A position she has held since the year 2014.
- (d) Before her current appointment as a director, she said that she has vast experience in the Education sector having worked as:
 - 1) High School Teacher-Kaporuso High school from 1990-1995
 - 2) TAC Tutor-Kembu Advisory Center from 1995 to June 1996

3) Bomet District ECD programme Officer-1996 to 2013.

- (e) When asked on the roles and duties of a Chief Officer, the nominee indicated that some of the roles of a Chief Officer would include being an accounting officer of the department, doing administrative duties, supervising the staff under the department, preparation of reports and linking the department with the donors and stakeholders.
- (f) On the professional skills that she has gained in public service that she would be utilize in her role as a chief Officer ,the nominee indicated that she possesses negotiation, research ,communication, leadership and team building skills.
- (g) The nominee was asked what role she played as a Director for Education in advising the previous government especially in purchase of buses for secondary schools among other infrastructural development. The nominee answered that she was a Director for ECDE and therefore played no role in the same. She further indicated that there was another director who was in Charge of Primary and secondary Education.
- (h) When asked why the previous government constructed classrooms for primary schools despite the role being a National Government function,the nominee stated that the government decided to do the same since most primary schools shared infrastructure with the ECDE centres.
- (i) The nominee was then asked to explain why there are several incomplete ECD projects across the County despite the sector being allocated millions of money and what role she played in advising the previous government on the same.The nominee stated that the department did the planning part but the funding was solely controlled from the Finance department and there was very little s he could do to address this. She however indicated that the new administration allowed for the department's participation and that she was optimistic that given the opportunity she would turn
- (j) When asked what the department was now doing to address the above issue and her participation in the same, the nominee said that the department was in the process of constructing 2 model ECDE centres per ward adding that schools in the lower zones were allocated Ksh.1,060,000 while the upper zones were allocated ksh.927,0000. She indicated that the government would soon do a ground breaking ceremony for construction of the classrooms.

- (k) The nominee could not however state why the designs for the 'model' ECDE centres did not include provisions for toilets and water supply instead she argued that her ministry would work with water department to supply water and that toilets will be considered in the subsequent projects.
- (l) On the issue of ECDE teachers, the nominee said that if given the position, she would work with the TSC in implementing the Scheme of Service for ECDE teachers currently being developed by the Commission. She also said that she will ensure that teachers on contract are employed on permanent terms and that she will ensure that each ECDE centre gets at least two teachers.
- (m) On how she will address the issue of Special Schools, the nominee answered that though Special Education was not a devolved function, her department will work pro-actively in order to identify children with Special Needs during their early years and ensure medical interventions are taken early to avert permanent disabilities.
- (n) On her take on Provisions of Chapter 6 of the Constitution and how she plans to apply the same, the nominee said that she will be bound by the national values and that transparency and accountability will be her guiding principles.
- (o) When asked on how she would implement the 7-point plan of the governor's manifesto, the nominee enumerated what the department was already doing in the education sector including; the equipping of Vocational Training Institutions and construction of ECDE centres.

5.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

The Committee having considered **Juliana Sigey Rono** as a nominee for the position of County Chief Officer, her curriculum vitae, academic qualification, experience and heard her oral submissions during the vetting exercise, made the following observations:-

- i. That she is a holder of Diploma in Education (Humanities), Bachelor of Education (ECE) and a Master of Education (Curriculum and Instruction).
- ii. That she is the current Director of Education for Bomet County Government.

- iii. That she has vast experience in the Education sector having worked as:
 - a) High School Teacher-Kaporuso High school from 1990-1995
 - b) TAC Tutor-Kembu Advisory Center from 1995 to June 1996
 - c) Bomet District ECD programme Officer-1996 to 2013.
- iv. That she has clear understanding and appreciation of the role of the office of County Chief Officer as established under the relevant law
- v. That she had submitted required documents including clearance certificates from KRA, HELB, Criminal Investigation Department, Credit Reference Bureau and Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission for assessment of compliance with requirements of Leadership and Integrity Act.
- vi. That on the basis of her professional background, her experience was relevant in discharging the mandate of the County Chief Officer, Education and Vocational Training.
- vii. The Committee found **Juliana Yegon Rono** suitable for appointment as the County Chief Officer in charge of the Department of Education and Vocational Training.

6.0 RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMITTEE

At the end of the vetting process, the Committee made the following recommendation:-

That having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to **Section 9(2) of Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017**, the Committee recommends that the County Assembly **approves** the nomination and subsequent appointment of **Juliana Sigey Rono** as Bomet County Chief Officer, in charge of the department of Education and Vocational Training.

Dissenting Opinion

During the vetting process, Honourable Joseah Chepkwony, a member of the committee and MCA for Chebunyo ward offered the following dissenting opinion:

THAT, the nominee, Mrs. Juliana Sigei Rono does not merit the appointment into the position on

grounds that:

1. Based on the list forwarded to the Assembly, the nominee was position 6 overall with an average score of 68.4 percent and therefore could not have qualified as the governor was supposed to pick only the top three scorers.
2. The governor did not put into consideration the issue of regional balancing, that it is not fair for two Cos to come from Kembu Ward while other wards did not have any. That the position for CEC, Gender, Youths and Culture had also been 'reserved' for Bomet East Sub County where Kembu ward falls under.

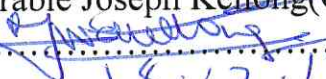

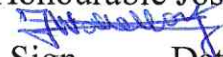
