STATEMENTS DUE ON 8th FEBRUARY, 2017 AT 9.00 A.M

1. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Samson Towett on 22nd June, 2016 from the Chairperson, Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) on motor vehicles procured by the County Executive. I recently noted that several Isuzu D-max double cabin motor vehicles, tractors, water boozers, lorries, truck cranes were acquired by the executive arm of county government.

In the statement, the chairperson should explain the following:

- a. How many in number, for each category, type and cost of the stated motor vehicles and machines were acquired in the FY 2015/16?
- b. What is the identity of the supplier and nature of agreement (Payment on delivery or Hire purchase)?
- c. How much revenues on average are being collected monthly by water boozers and whether they being declared as Appropriation in Aid (A.I.A)?
- d. In the adopted Budget and Appropriation committee report, the CEC member for Finance stated as follows;

“Purchase of motor vehicles: was allocated the amount to allow for payment of the vehicles already purchased. The vehicles are being paid for in installments which will spill over to the FY 2016/2017”

From the above CEC statement, I need the following explanations;

- i. The number of motor vehicles purchased through via hire purchase agreement in the FY 2015/16,
- ii. The name of the supplier and the total amount spent on motor vehicles in the FY 2015/16
- iii. Make and model of the motor vehicles purchased in the FY 2015/16

The statement was committed to the Committee on Infrastructure (Roads, Transport and Public works) (Statement No. 58)

2. Statement sought by Hon. Robert Serbai on 6th July, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries and Livestock concerning Embomos tea farm. In the Statement, the Chairperson should State:-
 - 1) Whether he is aware that the farm had been allocated Kshs.10.8 Million during the 2014/15 financial year?
 - 2) How the Money was spent and on which projects?
 - 3) The amount of revenue which the County is collecting from the farm?
 - 4) The number of workers which the farm has employed/hired?
 - 5) The expenditure which is used to run the farm;
 - 6) Whether the farm sustains itself;
 - 7) Why the employees have not been paid their June salary dues;
 - 8) What relationship does the farm has with Chepsol Sacco?
 - 9) Whether the Embomos tea farm lorry which collects tea leaves from farmers has been hired out to KTDA and if so how much revenue is the County government

getting from the arrangement and if not then who is benefitting from the arrangement?

3. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Josphat Kirui on 12th December, 2016 from the chairperson Committee on Health and sanitation on the precise number of health workers recently employed on contractual terms at the beginning of December, 2016. In particular the Hon. Member wished to be informed on;
 - a. Employee's individual profession and the health facility that each was deployed
 - b. What informed the decision of the department to hire the said workers
 - c. Whether those who had been shortlisted by the County Public Service Board were considered for the contractual employment
 - d. Whether the said contractual staff were sourced through County Public Service Board

The Statement was committed to the Committee on Health and sanitation (Statement No. 82)

4. Statement sought by Hon. John Molel on 7th December, 2016 from the Chairperson, Budget and Appropriation Committee on renovation of Governor's private residence using public funds. In Particular, the Hon. Members wished to be informed on the following;
 - a. How much was used to do the said renovation and were the payments done?
 - b. What sort of renovations were undertaken in the said private home?
 - c. Who was the contractor awarded the said contract and when were the renovations done?
 - d. Where are the minutes of the tender committee that sat to deliberate on the same?
 - e. What are the status of the pending cases and who has been charged?

The Statement was committed to the Committee on Budget and Appropriation (Statement No. 84)

5. Statement sought by Hon. Julius Korir on 13th December, 2016 from the chairperson of the Budget and Appropriation Committee regarding construction of the Governor's official office. In particular, the Hon. Member wished to be informed on the following;
 - a. How much is the total cost of construction of the Governor's official office adjacent to the High Court Building?
 - b. Which is the budget line was used to do the construction?
 - c. How much has been utilized so far?
 - d. Who is the contractor in site?

- e. Has there been any variation in the contract since the inception?
- f. When was the expected timeline for the project and if there was any extension, what necessitated it?
- g. When is the expected completion?
- h. The concerned department to supply the approved drawing, NEMA permit and NCA approvals acquire

The Statement was committed to the Committee on Budget and Appropriation Committee (Statement No. 85)

6. Comprehensive statement sought on 24th January, 2017 by Hon. Robert Serbai from chairperson committee on Labour and Public Service concerning the role of the county administrators. In the statement, the Chairperson should indicate;-
- a) Whether he is aware that the said administrators are currently recruiting members to *Chama Cha Mashinani (CCM)* and advocating for policies of the same party?
 - b) Who instructs the said officers to recruit members to CCM party?
 - c) What disciplinary measures has the County executive taken given that the said administrators are public officers and have therefore breached the provisions of section 15 of the Public Officers Ethics Act?

The Statement was committed to the Committee on Labour and Public Service (Statement No. 94)

7. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Samson Towett on 25th January, 2017 from the chairperson Committee on Labour and Public Service concerning enforcement officers in the county. In the response to the statement the Chairperson should indicate the following;
- i. Whether he is aware that the County Government trained 417 County enforcement officers despite the County Assembly not having approved the same?
 - ii. Why the officers trained were not issued with any certificates to prove the type of skills imparted on them?
 - iii. When will the department concern give the certificates to the said officers to assist them pursue further training in other institutions?

The Statement was committed to the Committee on Labour and Public Service (Statement No. 95)

8. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Leonard Kirui on 30th August, 2016 from chairperson, committee on Labour and Public service on the fate of ECD assistants employed by the County Government. In particular, the chairperson should inform on the following;
- a. Why the ECD assistants (recruited) have not received confirmation letters yet they have passed through the required employment procedures?

- b. What is the department's plan towards the issuance of confirmation letters?

9. Statement sought by Hon. Josphat Kirui on 25th October, 2016 from the Chairperson Committee on Labour and Public Service concerning the monthly NHIF deductions for County employees.

In the statement, the Chairperson should state;

- (a) Why the said deductions have not been remitted occasioning the County government to part with Kshs.2 Million to defray hospital expenses for Chief Officer Mrs. Baliach;
- (b) What measures are being undertaken by the County Government to address the issue given that the Vice-Chair of the County Public Service Board is due for treatment in India and has been turned down by NHIF citing non-remittance of monthly deductions?

10. Statement by Hon. Samson Towett on 7th December, 2016 from the chairperson Labour and Public Service committee. In particular, the Hon. Member wished to be informed on the following;

- a. How many acting Chief Officers do we have currently and who appointed them?
- b. Has the CEC Finance given the said acting chief officers to be accounting officers? If so, since when?
- c. How many senior Directors, Senior Directors and Assistant Directors by name do we currently have in place in each department?
- d. How many are acting in these positions and how many have been confirmed?
- e. Who appointed them and when was this done?
- f. Is the County Public Service Board aware of the presence of these acting Chief Officers, senior Directors, Senior Directors and Assistant Directors and if so, what was its role and involvement in the recruitment of the said officers?

11. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Sammy Chelule on 18th January, 2017 from the Chairperson, committee on Budget and Appropriation on the following;
- i. It is now approaching seven (7) months since F.Y 2015/16 ended yet the County Executive Member for Finance and Controller of Budget have yet to remit Assembly's outstanding balances on development and recurrent funds committed in the F.Y.

2015/16. I therefore wish to know when the said balances will be remitted to the Assembly.

- ii. Aware that the Governor assented to the Bomet County Appropriation Act 2016 and subsequent warrant with Assembly's development vote amounting to **Ksh.116, 408,716**. I am reliably informed that despite Assembly submitting work plan and requisition for development funds, the said funds have not been released to the Assembly. Through the Chairperson, I wish to know why the County Executive Member for Finance and Controller of Budget have not released the funds and when the said funds will be released to the Assembly.
- iii. CEC member for Finance and representative of the Controller of Budget should urgently appear before the committee on Budget and Appropriation to address the matter.
