8. MOTION (Hon. Haron Kirui, Member Committee on Energy, Environment, Water and Natural Resources)

THAT WHEREAS The Government of Kenya through National Water Harvesting and Storage Authority (NWHSA) prioritized development of the Bosto Dam Water Supply Project in Bomet County. This is one of the main flagship projects that aim to provide potable water to all in line with constitutional provisions and the right to water and Sustainable Development Goals (SDG);

Further aware that this flagship project was approved in 2013 and was to be completed in about three years to address 66 per cent of water shortage in Bomet and neighboring counties. Seven years on, the Sh22 billion Bosto dam and water project in Bomet county is yet to begin;

appreciating that the project will contribute to the attainment of the “Big Four” agenda particularly that of universal health care and food security through provision of clean drinking water to the target population including health

facilities, schools and ease hunger through small scale irrigation, dairy farming e.t.c;

Further aware that the Kenya Forest Service approved the construction of Bosto dam at the proposed site whereas the National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA) issued the license to that effect; the County Assembly therefore raises no objection to the implementation of the project seeing that Bomet will achieve a piped water coverage of approximately 80% from the current coverage of 10%;

CONCERNED that the delay has occasioned a delay to the enjoyment of the constitutional right to clean water by the residents of Bomet and neighboring counties and the county further risk losing the donor funding by Exim bank and the National Government;

NOW THEREFORE this County Assembly urges the County Executive Department for Water, Sanitation, Environment, Natural Resources and Climate Change to initiate the implementation of the project with the relevant National Government Ministry.
