NOTICES OF MOTION

Hon. J. Samoei (Nyangores Ward, UDA): Hon. Speakers, I beg to give notice of the following Motion; Aware that the office of the County Assemblies is established under art 176 (1) of the Constitution that there shall be a county government for each county consisting of the county assembly and while Article 176 (2) espouses the spirit of devolution to the effect that every county government shall decentralize its functions and the provisions of its services to the extent that it is efficient and practicable to do so.

Further aware that the office of the Member of the County Assembly is based at the Ward level and the County Assembly Service Board has a responsibility to facilitate the operation of the Member of the County Assembly (MCA) in order to have MCAs reach out to the electorate.

Acknowledging the MCAs are entitled to have partisan staff who will assist the office of the MCA to discharge its functions effectively.

Appreciating that the Commission for Revenue Allocation (CRA) vide a circular date 26th October, 2022 authorized the county assembly to utilize their recurrent budget within their own ceiling in order to meet among other things, the cost of salaries and allowances for partisan staff for MCA.

Realizing that the expenditure and management of the funds for the partisan staff is in strict conformity with Public Finance Management Regulations and County Assembly Imprest Policy.

Understanding that the names of the partisan staff should receive remuneration as may be determined by the County Assembly Service Board (CASB).

Taking into consideration the county assembly budget ceiling and the availability of funds as guided by the CRA circular.

Cognizant of the functions of the CASB as enumerated under section 11 of the County Assembly Service Act, this county assembly resolves as follows;

- i. That the CASB in exercise of its functions shall determine the budget allocation for payment of salaries and allowances of partisan staff for MCA in line with the CRA circular reference number CRA/FA/01/VOL. 2/110 dated 26th October, 2022.
- ii. That subject to the (i) above, the CASB shall determine the most transparent and efficient mode of payment of salaries and allowance for running of the ward offices.
- iii. That before payment of funds is authorized for allowances and salaries for partisan staff, the recipient of the fund shall submit documents of claim where necessary to warrant the requisition of funds from Controller of Budget CoB).
- iv. That after payment of funds is authorized for meeting the allowances and salaries for partisan staff, the decision shall before be processing funds for preceding period when it is due to surrender in accordance with the County Assembly Imprest Policy and Public Finance Management Regulations.

- v. That failure to comply with (iv) above, shall lead to discontinuation of payment until compliance is made in the subsequent months.
- vi. That the resolution of the CASB shall be binding taking into account the resolution of this Motion.

MOTION

COUNTY WARD EQUITABLE DEVELOPMENT FUND

Hon. D. Kirui (Ndaraweta Ward, UDA): Hon. Speaker, pursuant to Article 37 and 119 of the Constitution of Kenya, this County Assembly resolves to petition the National Assembly individually and collectively vide the annexed draft petition for the National Assembly to intervene and ensure that the County Ward Equitable Development Fund be incorporated in the proposed Constitutional Amendment Bill before the National Assembly by the Right Honourable Stephen Mule, MP and Honourable Gichungu Githinji, MP alongside other proposed funds namely the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF), National Government Affirmative Action Fund, the Senate Oversight Fund and the Economic Stimulus and Empowerment Fund before publication of the aforesaid bill or referred to the Senate in accordance with the rules of procedure of Parliament;

That the proposed Constitutional Amendment Bill in amending Article 204 of the Constitution should provide for the following with respect to County Wards Equitable Development Fund;

- i. That each county government shall allocate fund comprising of a certain percentage of the respective total county's annual budget estimates or as shall be advised by the CRA during the enactment of the County Allocation of Revenue Act to cater for County Ward Equitable Development Fund.
- ii. That all monies allocated to the County Ward Equitable Development Fund shall be considered as fund allocated to Wards pursuant to Article 206 (2) (c) of the Constitution to be administered in accordance with the provisions of an Act of Parliament.
- iii. That Parliament shall enact legislation to provide for the administration of the County Ward Equitable Development Fund.

Mr. Speaker, I am impressed by the County Assemblies Forum (CAF) which forum I am a member representing Bomet County Assembly to request members to pass this Motion because it is of great importance to our wards.

Therefore, I request this Assembly to pass this Motion with urgency so that we can secure the Fund that is constituted by the law by the NG-CDF. Our electorate have been requesting for County Ward Equitable Development Fund so that they participate directly on matters development.

If the MCAs are given this Find, it will be of great significance. I know the Members will not oppose because if you do, the electorate will be against you. Kindly support this Motion.

Mr. Speaker, in the Financial Year 2018/2019 in the second Assembly. Hon. Leonard Kirui formerly MCA representing Siongiroi Ward came up with an Equitable Distribution Bill.

Hon. Speaker, when I read the Motion I thought of Isaiah 60:22. It says that 'I the Lord will make it happen in the right time.' I think this is the right time.

I request Hon. Catherine Chepngetich who is a member of County Assemblies Forum (CAF) to second the Motion.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Catherine.

Hon. C. Chepngetich (Nominated MCA, UDA): Hon. Speaker, I thank the Motion Mover and the CAF for being concerned about our welfare of the members. The Members promised our electorate and they want to fulfil their promises. The County Ward Equitable Development Fund will be useful to the Members.

I second the motion.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Changmorik.

Hon. S. Changmorik (Longisa Ward, UDA): Hon. Speaker I rise to support the motion. CDF fund has helped schools and needy students. We have a lot of projects in our word that needs support and this money will solve a lot of issues. PFM act will enable equitable sharing of

resources. Hon Speaker this fund will enable great development in our wards. During public participation our people said they need the CDF fund. I urge the Members to support the motion.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Langat.

Hon. P. Langat (Merigi, INDEPENDENT): Hon Speaker I rise to support the Motion. The money that has always been at the National government is now at the County level. Our people will feel well represented. I urge all members to support the Motion.

Hon. W. Kiprotich (Chepchas Ward, UDA): Hon. Speaker I rise to make a comment on the Ward development fund. I thank the Motion Mover for bringing this Motion. The issue on ward equitable development fund is going to caution the wards preferably from rogue governors or rogue CECs. I loud the motion mover when he mentioned that the Second Assembly were able to discuss such a motion. I extend my thanks to Hon. Stephen Mule of Matungulu Constituency for coming up with such a motion, together with his friend Githinhi of Gishuku. Also were it not for the Supreme Court to say NG CDF is legal, then this amendment could not have come. This amendment will be in line with the Constitution. It is also going to bring into the aspect of Affirmative Action Fund, which in most cases targets youth and women. It is also going to provide the aspect of The Senate, referred to as the Senate Oversight Fund that is not there currently. We want to work hand in hand with the Senate and the County Assemblies Forum so that oversight is done well. Hon. Speaker I support the Motion.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Kibet.

Hon. N. Kibet (Kapletundo Ward, UDA): Hon. Speaker, I rise to support the Motion. I remember during my campaigns I promised a lot of things. I promised to support the talents of the youth and also the women where I promised to support them on Inua Mama na kuku. They usually ask for the support but I do not have funds to facilitate the same. By passing this Motion, the Ward Fund will give me the opportunity to support the talents and Inua mama na Kuku and other projects. I urge my colleagues to support the Motion because it will assist our society.

Hon. P. Ronoh (Kipsonoi Ward, UDA): Hon Speaker, this is a petition that we are beseeching the National Assembly to consider it. It is prudent for us to support the petition unanimously so that as it goes to the National Assembly since it contains a clause that gives the CRA powers to see it fit to allocate money that goes directly and be managed from the Ward level. A case study in Bomet, shows that there is unfair way of doing capital projects. If this motion goes through and

the National Assembly incorporates it in the amendment Bill it will mean that every ward will be developed equitably. When I look at article 204 of the constitution of Kenya 2010, it deals with the principles of public finance. The equalization fund sited in article 204, 205 is specific on what it does on the wards on water, roads and health. The sectors are devolved. I hope the national assembly shall consider our plea. I support Hon. Kiprotich for applauding Hon. Mule. He did not talk about County Assemblies but was particular about his Constituency. My prayer is that the Motion be passed and adopted by the National Assembly. I support.

Hon. V. Rop (Nominated MCA, UDA): Hon. Speaker I loud hon Dancel Kirui for the Motion. The NATIONAL Government Constituency Fund (NG-CDF) fund has done tremendous things on health, Water and Education Sectors. The remote areas can get services through the Ward Fund to be overseen by the Member of a County Assembly if he/she is equipped with funds at their disposal. That is when we shall have full realization of the intention of devolution which brings services closer to the people. Therefore, this petition to the National Assembly is really timely.

I also support this Petition because I have got aspirations to be MCA elected in Nyongores Ward in 2027 general election and I do not want to find challenges when I will be executing my mandate.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Josphat?

Hon. J. Kirui (Singorwet Ward, INDEPENDENT): Hon. Speaker, thank you. I must thank hon. D. Kirui for bringing such a Motion to this honourable Assembly, and I hope we will pass it without much discussion. This is one of those Motions that will assist us as MCAs to deliver on our Manifestos that we promised during campaign periods. Whoever coined the idea of devolution was very right and was looking forward to having most of the resources directed to the local level. I feel that if this County Wards Equitable Development Fund is incorporated, it will be the best way in which our people at the local level will be able to access equity in terms of resource allocation.

The oversight in terms of distribution of resources will have been solved. I therefore ask all the honourable members to pass this Motion.

Thank you. I support.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Ernest.

Hon. E. Rotich (Mogogosiek Ward, UDA): Mr. Speaker, thank you. I rise to support the Motion. I must thank honourable D. Kirui for bringing such a Motion to this Assembly. It must go in record that going by the kind of development that was witnessed with the NG-CDF, the same may be replicated in the County Government which was envisaged that services get close to the citizens. We pray that the National Assembly would act and have these funds incorporated in the County Government so that every time the County Government is making an allocation, they should consider allocating some funds to us. There are a lot of promises that we made to the people during our campaign and this Fund will assist us to take services close to the people.

We thank God because of NG- CDF. May be we will not be here. We are praying for this to be passed in the National Assembly.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Rosaline?

Hon. R. Cheptoo (Rongena/Manaret Ward, UDA): Hon. Speaker, thank you. Allow me to thank the mover and the seconder of this Motion. The motion is actually long overdue. I request the National Assembly to give us this chance so that we can do more in our wards. every County so that we can have an opportunity to handle some challenging issues affecting our people.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Thank you very much. From the debate, I think that the Mover of the Motion has no need for the right of reply.

Appreciating that the Commission on Revenue Allocation via its circular dated 26th October, 2022, authorized the County Assembly to utilize their recurrent budget within their own ceiling in order to meet among other things, the cost of salaries, allowance for partisan staff, and MCAs. Realizing that expenditure and the management of the funds for partisan staff is in strict conformity with Public Finance Management Act regulation and the County Assembly Imprest Policy. Understanding that the names of the partisan staff should receive remuneration as may be determined by the County Assembly Service Board (CASB), taking into consideration the County Assembly budget ceiling and availability of funds are guided by the Commission on Revenue Circular. Cognizant of the functions of CASB, as enumerate under Section 11 of the County Assembly Service Act (CASA), the County Assembly resolves as follows;

- i. That the CASB in exercise of its functions shall determine the budget allocation for payment of salaries and allowance of partisan staff, and MCAs in line with Commission

on Revenue Allocation Circular, Reference number, CRAFA01, Vol2 (110), dated 26th October, 2022.

- ii. That subject to (i) above, CASB shall determine the most transparent and efficient mode of payment, the salaries for running the Ward Offices.
- iii. That before the payment of funds authorizes for allowance, and salaries for partisan staff, the recipient of the funds shall submit documents of claim where necessary to warrant requisition of funds from Controller of Budget
- iv. That after payment of funds authorized for meeting, allowance, and salaries of partisan staff, the recipient shall be co-processing bank for the proceeding period when it is due to surrender imprest in accordance with the County Assembly Imprest Policy, and Public Finance Management Regulation.
- v. That failure to comply with (iv) above, shall lead to discontinuation of payment and if compliant
- vi. That the resolution of CASB shall be binding taking into account the resolution of this Motion.

I urge Members to pass this Motion because it will assist us to run our offices. I request Hon. Monica. to second.

Hon. M. Manyei (Nominated MCA, UDA): Hon. Speaker, I second this Motion. For an effective service delivery in our Wards, we must have this resource. It is also a chance for our youth to get employment opportunities brought closer to them in Ward level.

I second the Motion.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Thank you honourable Deputy Leader of Majority for moving the Motion and Hon. Monica Manyei for seconding.

Hon. D. Ngeno (Kongasis Ward, CCM): Hon. Speaker, from the mood of the Assembly, I request you to put the question.

Hon. Speaker (Hon. C. Korir): Hon. Members, in general circumstances, I would have given the mover to reply but there is nothing to reply.
