Hon. Deputy Speaker (How. W. Kiprotich): Hon. Members, there is a Statement due. It is indicated overleaf of the Order Paper. It is a Statement that was sought from the Chairperson of the Committee on Lands, Housing and Urban Planning by Hon. A. Langat.

COUNTY PENSION SCHEME

Hon. A. Maritim (Leader of Minority): Hon. Deputy Speaker, Sir, I rise to seek a comprehensive Statement from the Chairperson of the Committee on Labour and Public Service. Pursuant to Section 132 of the County Governments Act, 2012;

1. What measures are the Bomet Public Service Board put in place to ensure that all the permanent and pensionable employees of the county government belong to a pension scheme?
2. How many permanent and pensionable employees are members of a pension scheme? If not, why?

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3. Which pension scheme providers have the county government engaged to provide the services?
 4. How were the services of the pension scheme providers for all the permanent and pensionable employees arrived at if there is any?
 5. Were the employees consulted before the county government engaged the service of the pension scheme providers?
 6. Which department is spearheading the process of having a pension scheme provider?
 7. How many pension scheme providers have been engaged by the county government if there are any?

Hon. Deputy Speaker (How. W. Kiprotich): Hon. Members, the Statement stands committed to the Chairperson of the Committee on Labour and Public Service. The Committee has 14 days to reply. Owing to the ruling previously made in the House, the Committee must adhere to the due process in getting the answers to the Statement sought.

Since the Statement is of county importance, it shall be answered within the Chamber. Hon. Majority Leader.
